Bay Capital is an experienced, full-fledged, leading proprietary fundamental research-oriented boutique investment firm dedicated to investing in India. Bay Capital was established in 2006. The firm seeks to invest for the long term with a focus on delivering exceptional compound returns to its investors over time deploying a fundamental approach to equity investing in public markets. The team invests in a portfolio of businesses which are market leaders and capable of generating high returns on capital with sustainable advantages which allow them to compound earnings for a long time.

Investment Strategy

Bay Capital invests with an owner's mindset, focusing on high-quality businesses with durable competitive advantages. The strategy emphasizes long-term value creation by backing companies whose management think in decades, not quarters. We use fundamental research and a bottom-up stock-picking approach, supported by on-ground due diligence across India's diverse and complex markets. India's structural transformation—rising incomes, improved public services, and digital adoption—creates unique investment opportunities in four key themes – Consumption, Digitisation, Financialisation, and Outsourcing. Our preference lies in capital-light models delivering strong returns on capital.

Market Commentary

Indian equity markets returned to negative territory in May amid uncertainty over the US-Iran peace deal. The NIFTY 50 returned -1.9% in local currency terms as well in USD terms for the month. The iShares MSCI India ETF returned -1.7% in USD terms.

On the flows front, Foreign Portfolio Investors continued to remain net sellers, withdrawing ~\$3 billion during the month. Domestic Institutional Investors continued to be net buyers, deploying approximately \$9 billion into Indian equities.

The macro file on India this month reads bearish, and not without reason. Nearly 45% of India's crude oil supply transits the Strait of Hormuz, and an extending conflict in the region has made the energy supply picture more precarious. The rupee has continued to weaken. Most economists have trimmed their growth forecasts to around 6%. And while the rest of the world accelerates capital deployment into artificial intelligence infrastructure, India's contribution to that build-out remains limited.

Read top-down, there is very little to like. It is no surprise that foreign investors have continued to sell. The global AI rush has been so acute that the market capitalisations of Taiwan and South Korea have both now surpassed India's.

Our Thoughts

Our view, however, is different, not because we dismiss any of this, but because of where we look. Our world view is built from the ground up: a collection of specific, granular observations across the franchises we track, month after month. Seen from there, the picture is considerably steadier than the headlines suggest. The competitive advantages of these businesses remain strong, and in several cases, they are widening.

Macro headwinds are real. But they are also temporary. The businesses we own are not macro calls – they are structural compounders, operating in industries where the gap between leader and follower widens regardless of the cycle.

The portfolio currently comprises 39 franchises, each a market leader (among the top three) in its respective industry. Collectively, these businesses deliver both earnings growth and return on capital employed (ROCE) in excess of 20% and are currently trading at a PE of 23.1x one-year forward earnings. Their strong competitive positioning and highly scalable business models provide a long runway for sustained earnings compounding in the years ahead.

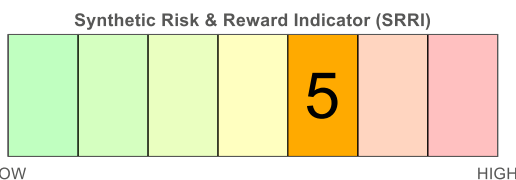

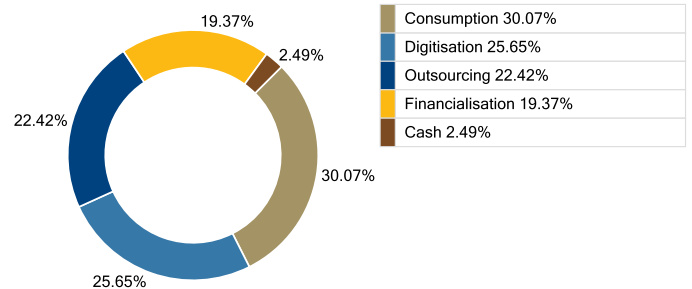
Risk Indicator
